The posuk tells us that Moshe Rabbeinu had to encourage his brother Aharon to approach the Mizbeach and perform the Avodoh because at first he was reluctant to do so. What could have been holding Aharon back? In the Toras Kohanim we find that Aharon hesitated because the Mishkon appeared to him in the form of an ox and he was afraid of its similarity to the Eigel which he had unfortunately played a part in. But in that case why indeed did Moshe push him towards it? The Gerrer Rebbe, the Imrei Emess z"l, explains that Moshe was teaching him a message that applies to all of us: the very area that we find most challenging is also the area we need to tackle head on. Quoting Reb Chaim Vital z" he writes that many people try to avoid the things they find tough in life. But actually those are the very things we were sent to Earth to fix! On the contrary, if we find certain situations tough, it's a sign from Shomayim that we can tackle them and that we have been given the strength and the tools to do so. Moshe therefore encouraged Aharon, and all of us, with the words: Krav el hamizbeach! Don't run away! If you see a challenge, draw close to it, for that is your purpose in life...

Rav Yosef Dov (Yoshe Ber) Solevetchik z"l of Brisk, the Beis Halevi, whose Yohrzeit is this coming week on 4th Iyar was born near Minsk, to Reb Yitzchak Zev Soloveitchik. Rav Yitzchak Zev was a grandson through his mother of Rav Chaim of Volozhin z"l. When he was 11 his father brought him to Volozhin to learn under his uncle, Rav Itzeleh, where he eventually became the Rosh Yeshiva alongside the Netziv z"l. The famous sefer Beis Halevi is comprised primarily from the shiurim he gave in Volozhin. He later on became the Rov of Brisk.

Prior to becoming the Rov, he had formed an opinion regarding a certain din of *treifos*. R' Yoshe Ber held that this specific case was a treifoh despite the fact that the Shach, one of the most authoritative commentators on the Shulchan Oruch, had *paskened* that it was *kosher*.

After R' Yoshe Ber became the Rov, a *shailah* arose for the town butcher regarding this particular *din*, and of course, R' Yoshe Ber stated his ruling that it was *treif*. However, the Rav told the butcher that since the Shach rules differently, it's not right that you should have to suffer a loss because of my *chumra*, so the Rov compensated the butcher from his own pocket!

In doing so Rav Yoshe Ber was expressing true emunoh and integrity, paskening based on his own shikul hadaas, but never losing sight of the needs of others. Indeed Emunoh is not just about faith in Hashem; it is also about behaving faithfully. Like the Beis Halevi.
